Once upon a time some 15 years ago, after the annual snowbird migration north, NCC member and Hall of Famer Dick Brackett noted that NCC's 12 recently vacated grand green lawns cried out for players vigorously swinging mallets, scoring wickets, and just having a good old time. It occurred to Dick that the club could issue an invitation to non-members and to the local community to come play and see what the sport of croquet being played behind the tall, imposing hedges was all about. "The NCC gave me carte blanche to try new things which I did. Some hugely successful, some not," he says. Thus, was born the concept of an NCC Summer League.

The first two years there were 16 teams. Today, as many as 36 teams play once or twice each week for five weeks. Each team needs to have a compelling name, and at season's end the most creative name receives an award. Among the most memorable names - Awww Good Try, Wicketpedia, Lawn Rangers, Summer Reign and the 2022 winner, With Mallets Aforethought. Now that's clever! (Continues Page 3)

It Might Be Summer, But It Sure Is Busy Here!

On June 12, the Club's members overwhelmingly adopted new Articles of Incorporation and new Bylaws. Ever since, many of us have been very busy implementing the changes.

Going forward, Club members will elect specific Club officers to staggered two-year terms. In this transitional year members will elect the President, the Treasurer and the Director At Large, each for a term of two years, and a Vice President and Secretary each for a term of one year. (Thereafter, in future years, only 2 or 3 of the officer positions will be up for election.) The slate of candidates will come to members from the Nominating Committee, which is now fully independent from the Board. That Committee's members are Gerry Eubank, Bruce Hindin, Kathryn Robertson, John Strasser (Chair), Lynda Sudderberg, Stephen Tasker, and Allison Worthington, and they are already hard at work. Any member desiring to be elected to an office must submit a nominating packet to the Committee. If the Committee's slate of candidates does not include a member who nevertheless still wants to run for office, she or he may petition to run for a specific office. Some details are in Article V of the Bylaws and some will be in procedures the Nominating Committee is now developing.

As for all our other committees, where much of the Club's work is accomplished, they are fully engaged. The new Bylaws extended their terms to June 30, 2024, and later this year the Board will create staggered two-year terms for their members. We really value the energy, commitment, and thought our committees provide.

We also have Task Forces that focus on specific projects on specific timelines. For example, this summer **Suzanne Turner** leads the effort, required by our new Bylaws, to draft operational policies, procedures and rules governing the Board's activities. (And the old Governance Handbook and old Committee Charters are being abolished because the new Bylaws and the new procedures will displace those outdated documents.)

Finally, despite all the work and the heat and rains, several of your Board members are still trying to improve how they play croquet. I got into this because I fell in love with croquet. Board work is important, but it takes time away from actually playing. So I end this by urging each of you to get out on the courts and have fun!
